Title: Diocesan Organiser

Accountable to: National Fundraising Officer

Location: Your local diocese

Contract Type: Voluntary

Commitment: Flexible – Approx 1 day per week

Introduction:

Key Tasks:

- Our Diocesan Organisers facilitate the vital partnership between the Diocese and Life, so that the charity can maximise opportunities for local supporters to give their time, money and voice.
- You will be the main contact for Life with the responsibility to raise awareness of our charity, to disseminate information and news, and to coordinate fundraising activities wherever possible.
- This role is about building relationships, developing links, recruiting volunteer colleagues and sustaining a broad community of supporters.

What skills do I need:

- The confidence to network and influence people
- Good public speaking and relationship building skills
- A proactive outlook
- A commitment to give 3 to 4 days per month to the role
- An understanding of early years issues
- A willingness to engage with people from all backgrounds
- A preparedness to do your role in partnership with the National Fundraising Officer and to keep them regularly updated
- Basic IT skills (including the use of email and online video conferencing platforms) as well as confidence in using the internet and social media channels.
- The ability to organise your own transport (either a full driving licence and access to a car or use of public transport)
