Be the key contact for fundraising in your local community to raise money from a variety of activities such as collections, social events, supporting our national campaign.

Don't be put off by the word 'fundraising'. It's about much more than that as a group. You raise money, but it's also about building relationships, recruiting more volunteers & building a community.

Typical Tasks:

- Organising and attending events and collections in your local area, such as the Life National Campaign in September.
- Help the Fundraising Group plan and organise a calendar of fundraising events & share with the Head of <u>Community & Events Fundraising</u> at Life.
- Building relationships with local networks, organisations, schools and social groups to host events.
- Delegating tasks and responsibilities to other volunteers within your fundraising group.
- Making sure fundraising policies and procedures are followed; including all roles are maintaining their required records.
- Lead the group on all activities.
- Encourage support for Life by forming and maintaining relationships with local supporters.
- Recruit and welcome new members to the group when required.
- Respond to queries from the public.

- Be friendly and helpful
- Be able to generate enthusiasm and motivate people.
- Have good communication and networking skills.
- Have a passion for organising events.
- Good knowledge of the local area.
